



THE JOEY FUND

The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation was established in 1955 and exists to ensure that a cure and control for cystic fibrosis (CF) will be found. In 1986, The Joey Fund was started by the friends and associates of Joe O'Donnell when his son Joey passed away after a courageous battle with Cystic Fibrosis.

Each year the Foundation coordinates Joey Fund events as a means of raising both awareness and the necessary funds to battle cystic fibrosis. More importantly, these events help to keep Joey's memory alive and help keep us focused on our ultimate goal--finding a cure and control for this dreaded disease.

ABOUT CYSTIC FIBROSIS

Cystic fibrosis is a life-threatening, genetic disease that causes persistent lung infections and progressively limits the ability to breathe. An estimated 30,000 children and adults in the United States have CF.

In people with CF, a defective gene causes a thick, buildup of mucus in the lungs, pancreas and other organs. In the lungs, the mucus clogs the airways and traps bacteria leading to infections, extensive lung damage and eventually, respiratory failure. In the pancreas, the mucus prevents the release of digestive enzymes that allow the body to break down food and absorb vital nutrients. In the 1950's, few children with CF lived to attend elementary school. Since then, tremendous progress in understanding and treating CF has led to dramatic improvements in the length and quality of life for those with CF. Many people with the disease can now expect to live into their 30's, 40's and beyond.

To reduce the risk of COVID-19 the Foundation is taking steps to host safe events for our community. Please be advised that events may be subject to change at any time based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local health officials. Important Note on Attendance at Foundation Events To help minimize the risk of COVID-19, we ask that attendees at CF Foundation events follow these steps:

- Where mandated, practice physical distancing and maintain at least a safe 6-foot distance from persons outside of their household.
- Face masks are encouraged and should be worn in accordance with local guidelines. (Note, children under two years of age should not wear masks due to safety concerns and therefore should only attend outdoor CF Foundation events where they are able to distance and stay within their family group.)
- Follow basic infection, prevention and control practices by regularly washing hands with soap and water or with an alcohol-based hand gel, and by covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue or your inner elbow.
- Persons with CF should consult their physician before participation in any in[1]person event as they may be at an increased risk for severe illness from COVID[1]19.
- For indoor events, it is CFF policy to invite only one person with CF to be in[1]person at the event at a time. For outdoor events, people with CF should maintain a safe 6-foot distance from persons outside of their household at all times. For Your Safety and the Safety of Others
- For the health and wellbeing of the CF community, we strongly encourage that participants be fully vaccinated and have received the CDC recommended booster shot when joining us in-person for the event.
- Please be advised certain localities and venues may require you to be fully vaccinated and show proof of vaccination. We will communicate these requirements in event communications.
- We are counting on the fact that you appreciate the potential consequences of exposing members of the CF community to COVID-19 and will not attend an event if you are feeling ill or have been recently exposed to COVID-19.
- We cannot guarantee that all people in attendance at the event, including participants, sponsors, volunteers, vendors, or others, have been fully vaccinated.

Take Route I-95 North into New Hampshire. Take Exit 2 to Route 101 toward Exeter/The Hamptons. Keep Right at the fork in the ramp. Merge onto Route 101 West toward Exeter. Take Exit 12 and go Right at end of ramp onto Route 111. Travel 2.3 miles East on Route 111 and turn Left onto Route 151. Continue 1.6 miles North on Route 151 and turn at second Left onto Winnicutt Road. Go 1.5 Miles on Winnicutt Road and turn Right into GOLF CLUB OF NEW ENGLAND
