THIRD PARTY FUNDRAISING IDEAS



- Dress Down Day Charge a small fee and allow your co-workers to dress down on a day they normally would not be able to.
- Crazy Hat Day Charge a small fee and have your co-workers wear a hat for the day.
- Summit Day Charge a small fee and have your co-workers wear red, yellow, and blue to show their support for The Summit Center.
- Change Wars A fun challenge between individuals or departments! Set up jars around the office where each team collects points by adding loose change to their jars (1 cent = 1 point). Want to take it one step farther? Teams can "sabotage" other teams by adding dollar bills to the jars (\$1 = -100 points)! Have a small prize (donuts, pizza, gift cards, etc.) for the winning person or team.

Friends and Family

- Give It Up! Challenge your friends and family to give up a habit (ex: buying their morning coffee or lunch) for a period of time and donate what they would have spent.
- Cookie Sale Ask people to buy homemade cookies for a cause!
- Offer a Service Shovel your neighbors driveway, cut their grass, or take their dog for a walk in exchange for a donation.
- Garage Sale Hold a garage sale and ask people to donate their unwanted items for you to sell.

For the Kids

- Craft Sale Have the kids draw or paint a picture and help them sell to friends and family.
- Read-A-Thon Have people pledge to donate a certain amount per page or book that is read.

Post Updates

Post to your social media with updates on your fundraising progress. Don't forget to thank donors and make announcements when you reach milestones toward your goal.



Use Pictures

Include pictures in your posts to attract more attention. Include your pictures from last year's event or of your preparations for this year!



Be Engaging

Don't be afraid to tag people in your posts or use a personalized hashtag for your Walk team! Remember to reply to any comments and thank everyone who likes or shares.
